

TUITION EQUITY BILL

- Governor Northam signed it on in early April
- Goes into effect July 1, 2020
- Students must show that they have been in a Virginia High School for at least 2 years
- Graduated or earned a GED from Virginia
- Parents must have filed taxes for the last two years before students freshman year in college
- Work with your counselor

WORKFORCE/APPRENTICESHIPS



Arlington Employment Center provides assistance in finding a job such as providing support to write a resume, practice interviewing skills and acquiring the skills needed to obtain a certain job.

Apprenticeships are job-training programs which incorporate both hands-on training and education of the theory.

Apprenticeships can be accessed through the Department of Labor, possibly CTE courses, adult education, or through career training.
