#### **GETTING STARTED**

- Turn in or submit your brag sheet to your counselor if you did not do so by the end of your junior year.
- Create an
   organizational system
   for yourself that
   shows requirements,
   deadlines, fees etc.
- Talk boundaries with your parent/guardian.
   Who is paying for college? If parents are contributing, how much?
- Work on your <u>college</u>
   <u>essay</u> and have
   someone edit it!
- Decide if you will apply early or by the schools regular decision deadlines.

#### IN GENERAL

- Compile a list of schools you plan on applying to. 7 - 9 is a good number.
- Many Schools are test optional. If you take and SAT or ACT the student is responsible for sending scores.

- Check your email daily!
   Your high school and

   you a lot of information
   that you cannot miss.

## The College Application Process "Simplified"

### Step 1: Creating Your Common App Account


- Common App is the #1 platform that students use to apply to college. Over 1,000 colleges are on the Common App.
- Colleges on your Common App list will automatically roll over into your Naviance account, which is helpful.
- Any schools that are not on the Common App must be added to your Naviance manually. See step 3.



Step 2: Access Your Naviance Account Through

# Step 3: Adding Colleges to Your Naviance Account

Naviance is the platform that APS uses to send transcripts and other supporting documents to your colleges. In order for us to know where to send your documents, the colleges you are applying to must be listed in your Naviance account. ADD COLLEGES TO NAVIANCE IF NOT LISTED IN THE COMMONAPP.

Step 4: Matching Your Naviance and Common App
Accounts

In order for us to send supporting documents (transcripts, recommendations, school reports, etc) to your Common App schools, these accounts must be matched. Video tutorial can be found HERE Do not match Naviance with Common App until senior year

# Step 5: Requesting Transcripts Through Naviance

Most of your colleges will require you to request that we send your high school transcript to your schools on your behalf. HERE is a short video outlining the process.

If you are a NVCC DE student you may get a request to submit your NVCC transcript to your colleges. If so, <u>HERE</u> are the instructions.



# Step 6: Requesting Teacher and Counselor Recommendations

### **Teacher Recommendations**

Recommendations from your APS teachers are requested through your Naviance account. Most of your college applications will require one or two teacher recommendations.

Click <u>HERE</u> for a tutorial showing you how to request a teacher recommendation through your Naviance account.

Before sending your recommender(s) the invitation through Naviance, you MUST ASK YOUR TEACHER(S) FIRST. Most scholarship applications will also ask for one or two letters or recommendation.

All other outside recommenders (coaches, mentors, other outside supporters) are recommended through your Common App account under "other recommenders"

HERE IS A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE ON HOW TO ASK FOR A TEACHER RECOMMENDATION

### **Counselor Recommendations**

Most colleges will require a recommendation from your school counselor. In order for you to get a recommendation from your school counselor you must ASK in person and you must fill out a "Brag Sheet" which is a series of open ended questions that allow you to brag about yourself and let your counselor know more about you and your unique situation.

"Brag Sheets" can be completed in your Naviance account. Upper right hand corner click on the circle with your initials on it – from there you will see "surveys from your school." You can also fill out the Word Document Brag Sheets below.

### **Brag Sheets**

Brag sheets are a way for you to help your counselor and teachers write letters of recommendation. These forms give them more insight into who you are outside of school and your interests. Fill out these forms, and share them with your counselor and teachers when you ask them for a letter of recommendation! Student
